
POGIL

Learning. POGIL is an
active/engaged teaching
strategy that focuses on process
skills, such as communication,
teamwork, problem-solving, and
information processing.

WHEN TO USE IT?

Any time an active/engaged teaching strategy is desired that emphasizes the acquisition of affective or cognitive skills along with course content.



HOW TO USE IT?



Work with learners to create a productive, supportive, team learning environment. Guide learners through the inquiry process to reach a valid, knownto-the-field (but unknown to them) conclusion. See <u>POGIL.org</u> for example training sessions and additional information.

WHY USE IT?

Research suggests that this is how most people learn best. It also teaches learners the value of teamwork and inquiry as a process that can be developed, rather than simply focusing on

getting the right answer.
